## The Languages Learning Journey:

- In KS3 students are building the basics and foundations in order to become great language learners. In both French and Spanish we investigate the grammar and vocabulary needed in order to develop an understanding of the way that language systems work, as well as gaining a deeper insight into the cultural aspect of the Hispanic and Francophone world.
- In KS4 students will develop further understanding of the four skills required to increase fluency within their language. Continuing on from KS3 we will practise our speaking, listening, reading and writing in order to become well rounded linguists.
