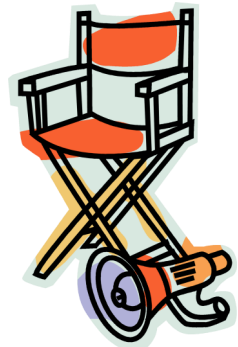




# Drama at Daubeney Academy



- Students will be assessed in two practical performances—one of a scripted piece, one of a piece they have devised
- Non-performance options are available, these, however these are only suitable for independent workers as they are heavily coursework based.
- Students will need to create a portfolio to support each of their performances and to document the decisions that they have made
- Students will sit a written exam where they will answer questions on the play 'Blood Brothers' and write a review of a performance they have seen
- Students will be invited to view a staged performance outside of lesson time, this is vital to their GCSE written paper
