## Essential Values of Care for use with Individuals in Care Settings

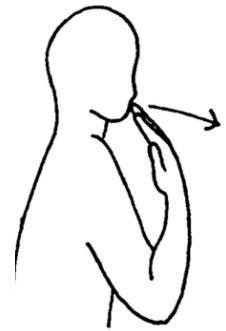
Written Exam—1 hour, 60 marks

Students explore the rights of individuals seeking care and the methods of promoting the rights and best interest of those individuals. In addition, students discuss legislation and how this impacts the care that is provided and ensure s the safety of service users and providers.

## Communicating and working with Individuals in Health, Social Care and Early Years Settings

Written Assessment—60 marks

Students learn the importance of effective communication and experience some of the barriers to communicating with individuals with specialist needs. Students develop confidence in communication and evolve their understanding of the needs of others.



## Creative Activities to Support Individuals

Learners will have the opportunity to explore the different types of creative activities that are available to individuals and understand how important it is to promote creative activities, so that the needs of the individuals are met.

## Using Basic First Aid Procedures

Research carried out by the BBC has found that nearly 59% of people would not feel confident trying to save someone's life and around a quarter of people would do nothing and wait until the emergency services arrived.
